



## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQ'S)

**1. I'm well over 18 and I'm interested in your program. Can I enroll?** YES! Just know the wording is targeted toward teens but you are welcome to enroll and we can personalize and adjust the program to your adult needs.

**2. I see you have corporate sponsors. Does this influence the program material and points of views?** No! Corporate sponsors allow the Learning Life Company to offer scholarships to students and schools, therefore keeping the program free to those who receive the scholarship. Some of the projects may include a sponsor's business or the project will refer to the sponsor to explain a service. For example, it may refer to a specific bank and their financial services to illustrate a point within the Me & Money theme. This does not compromise the integrity of the projects or lessons learned in any way; rather it's just a 'sample' and at the same time provides advertising to our generous sponsors.

The Learning Life Company carefully chooses honorable sponsors whose target market includes teenagers and/or young adults out of high school. The most common way to 'pay back' a sponsor is by having their logo on our marketing materials and to recognize their generosity.

**3. Do I need to be concerned about an inappropriate relationship between an Evaluator and my child?** No, absolutely not!

### EVALUATOR - MEMBER RELATIONSHIPS

Evaluators are required to keep conversations with students in **The Toolbox** where The Learning Life Company can monitor it and keep records.

### Topics the program & its Evaluators do not discuss:

- Members' relationships with their parents.
- Members' sexual relationships or curiosities.
- Members' family planning needs.
- Members' emotional disabilities.

-Members' religious questions or concerns. However, members are more than welcome to include their (legal) religious beliefs and practices as they act to complete the Get in the Game projects. (For example- referring to their church for community involvement with a Get in the Game project.)

**The GET IN THE GAME Program and Learning Life Company offers UNBIASED information on:**

- Choosing and educating themselves to make their own decisions about their political preference or stance.
- Choosing a college or trade school.
- Choosing a career path.
- Discussions about healthy foods and a healthy home are NOT driven by an activist group. The only 'stance' given is to be economically friendly. For example, if a Member says they are vegetarian or vegan *in their profile* then the feedback will be personalized, as promised, and could potentially include an organic recipe in the Home Management and Shopping section, while another member might receive a meat recipe.

On that same token, for the Charitable Contribution project one Member might choose PETA while another Member might choose a charity that benefits hunting. The Learning Life Company has no political agenda.

- Discussions about economics and being environmentally friendly are NOT driven by an activist group or any specific relationship with any charity or movement, and do not in any way benefit the Learning Life Company outside of sharing advertising resources.
- Discussions about charities are not driven by any specific relationship with any charity organization, and do not in any way benefit the Learning Life Company outside of sharing advertising resources.
